Writing a cover letter with minimal effort

- Type the prompt: "Below is my CV/resume and the job description of a job I'm applying for"
- Copy-paste your CV/resume's text
- Copy-paste the job description
- Type the prompt: "I want you to write me a cover letter that's customized for this job description. Make sure it has the standard structure of a cover letter, including the opening, body, and closing sections. Make it personal, persuasive, and enthusiastic. Highlight my relevant skills and experiences. And demonstrate how I can bring value to the table. End with a call to action."

Your cover letter is your pitch.
